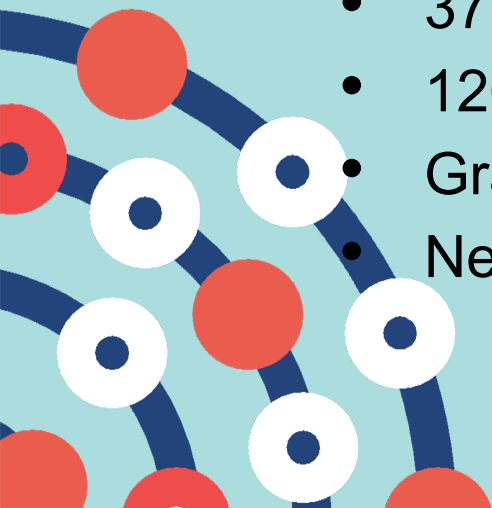
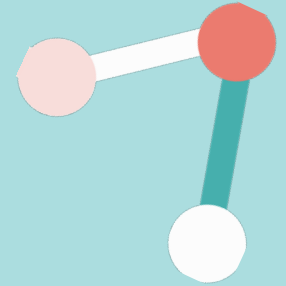
- Increase our coproduction and subsequent impact within the collaboration

Challenges

- Member Engagement – immense service pressures on health and care organisations making engagement and collaboration difficult
- Delays in recruitment of staff contributing towards current underspend
- Research Development Networks and roundtables progressing at different rates
- Clearer examples of implementation being requested from Department of Health and Social Care, on national priorities (e.g. discharge / A&E admissions)
- Finalising ALL Membership contracts in time for business plan and securing the co-funding commitments 2024-26

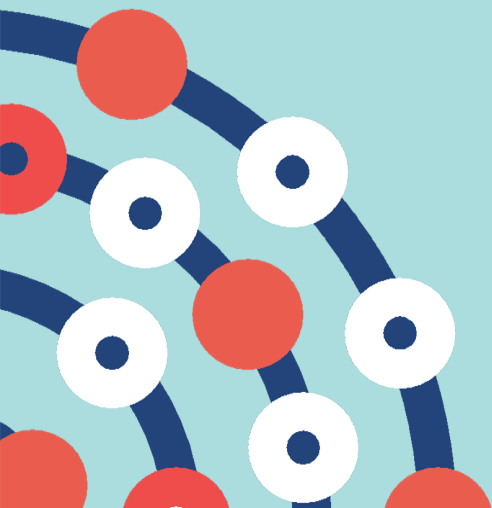
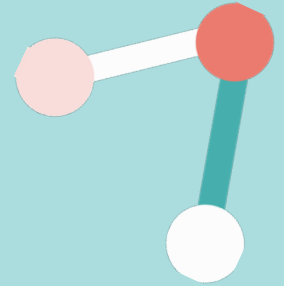
